As well as people from the Netherlands and Sweden who had Greybook meetings in their part of the world. The FSC was a once in a lifetime experience. I got to be a part of history in the making I got to learn of our history from addicts who had been there. I made friends with people all over the world. I got to hear about Grey Book meetings all over the world and the progress the meetings have made and the addicts they have reached. It was bittersweet to leave. I can't wait to see them all next year at the FSC and hopefully some new faces. Also, I got a Purist T-Shirt and I finally felt like I had become one of the many amazing addicts of this Fellowship family.

So, this year I had the amazing privilege of going to Hamburg Pennsylvania for the Fellowship Service Conference. It was an amazing journey into recovery. I didn't get much sleep cuz I didn't want to miss a single moment. Sitting there amongst people with so much clean time I was completely entranced the entire time.

Well, let me start from the beginning. We had 10 addicts riding and it was gonna be a tight fit for everyone and we were concerned about bring back literature so I made a big jump in faith and asked my mom if I could use her truck. Mind you that she's still paying for this truck and through the miracles of NA she agreed. It took me back a min and I couldn't believe what I was hearing. The ride there was long and I was so tired from not sleeping the night before because I was so excited to have this experience. I bought a cooler full of food so that we could have a picnic on the way and just be together instead of getting fast food.

Finally, we got there about 5 and I was nervous because I'm not the best person at meeting new people. But that fear quickly went away as I was embraced in a hug of love and acceptance. Again, to be sitting amongst 200+ years of recovery had me in awe. That night we had a campfire meeting that I couldn't even contemplate leaving. There were 3 addicts that I've only seen online and 2 that I had just met that were long time members of the fellowship that I HAD to hear every word they had to say. As tired as I was and as bad as I wanted to go to sleep, I just couldn't find it in me to leave the experience strength and hope that these and others had to share. So, I didn't get to bed until 3am.

Day 2 I woke up at 7 because I needed to experience more of these amazing people I had just met. I met some more people as I got comfortable on Sat. I introduced myself to the people that came from the Netherlands and had a few long conversation with addicts. Then one of my favorite parts of the conference was seeing and holding all the historical literature that addicts had. A "hip recovery" book, and uncut baby blue, and hard bound basic text, and so much more. I also began to learn how the fellowship does things and how it differs from the way the other service structure of NA. Then when I was ready to go to bed I wasn't allowed because Sunday was my 1-year NA birthday. And receiving my 1-year medallion was so humbling. To have made it one year and be able to celebrate at the FSC was great.

Sunday was the last day of this great adventure and I couldn't have asked for anything more amazing. My Great Grand sponsor presented me with my one-year dog tag which Ive heard is a pretty big deal and then we went to his house where the original baby blue was first cut. I got to see the spot where he goes to meditate, I got to help load books in the truck to bring home and help save the lives of addicts. Then we headed home.

Basically this was one of the most amazing, insightful, and spiritual get aways I've ever had. To connect with addicts that are truly in recovery. To know without a shadow that I was loved and accepted just the way I am brought me to tears and moved me to my soul. To feel genuine hugs from strangers (at least 300) felt so good and so right. Now I'm a professional hugger. I'll probably add more to this later but for now that's all I got. I'm still processing everything.

And I don't want to draw attention. lt's happened a couple times this week. I had a cookout at my mom's campgrounds for home group members and wanted to post the awesome

time we had so bad. BUT I know that it would cause drama with my mom and my sister. See my sister has no faith in the program that I work and the changes that have been made in my life and the eyes of the people that see and hear my experiences over the past year. What she doesn't know and I've asked to have kept quiet is that while she is doubting me and waiting for me to fail, I'm the one buying the food for her daughter's birthday. My mom was going to but she's out of work over the summer (she's a teacher) now and takes care of my daughter but my sister still asks my mom to pay for the party. So tonight, I told my mom that I would take care of the food. But not to tell Also giving my cousin a anyone. graduation present. I'm not able to attend and I barely know the girl. I was invited but unfortunately, I have to work so I gave my mom some money to add to what she was giving her and asked her to keep it quiet. I don't know why. I just don't need or desire the recognition. One is to help my mom and so my niece can have a nice bday and the other is for an awesome kid that's done great in school and has earned it. I don't understand it, it's just a feeling that I need to remain anonymous in stuff like this. Maybe I'm wrong. Maybe I'm not saying why I feel this right. Maybe I'm just doing the next right thing for the right reason and that's what matters to me today.

For me I thought I had a relationship with the God of my understanding before I came to NA. God made self-clear for me while in prison I'm not going to share the details here but there was no doubt after that. When it was close to time for me to get out most people are counting the days to get out. I was terrified as I knew even though I had learned how to live on the inside and had a piece of mind that never had before then, I was going back to my old life on the outside. I didn't know how to live on the outside. was terrified of the structure going away. What I didn't realize was that still wasn't living. It took some time but not long after being released I was back to using just as much if not more. I was back to living a life of crime and insanity and hated myself once again for it. Commitment was not followed through with. This was how I lived before I found NA. My relationship with God was no longer existent just like before. I had given up on stopping using and thought I would use the rest of my days.

Somehow, I made it to the rooms of NA. I was in and out for years trying to do things my own way over and over again. After banging my head against the wall enough times, I found the Gift Of Desperation that made it possible for me to be willing to try something different. My way clearly wasn't working as I was at a crossroads with 2 years clean where I still hadn't surrendered to the WF of NA and was wanting to die clean. I found how to have relationships first with myself, then others and God. I found relationships take commitment and time. No more taking the indirect approach as had done my whole life. It was time for me to understand that life has to be planned by me and I have to be responsible for my recovery. My relationship with a God of my own understanding has grown more and more over the years through living the NA way instead of my way.

Today I am proud of the man that God has helped me become. One that lives by spiritual principles instead of just saying I do. One that knows all the glory goes to God as all I have done is surrendered my will and my life over to the care of God. Life may not happen as I plan and today, I can accept that as I am not God and that is ok. All the resentments and anger that I have had over the years towards God have all been a result of things happening because of man's will and their free choices. God got me to NA and NA keeps my relationship with God alive so thank God for NA and thank NA for God.


